## From the Headteacher

With media reports flooded with the news of the Coronavirus, there is no better time to celebrate and enjoy the achievements of our children and families.

Our attendance figures have dropped considerably in the last week due to parents choosing to keep their children at home. The government have released clear guidance and daily updates, which the school is following and there is no need to keep children home unless they have been in contact with someone who is affected and are showing symptoms. All absence is recorded as unauthorised and the Education Welfare Service are monitoring this closely, in the worse cases this may involve issuing penalty fines so please keep the school informed daily.

We have also been informed that it is not necessary to cancel planned educational visits so timetabled trips will go ahead unless we are advised otherwise. We have added to risk assessments the need for children wash hands more regularly and the teachers will be taking sanitising hand gel with them for all children, but you are welcome to pack your child some of your own if you prefer.

They will also be taking sanitizing wipes for surfaces where children will eat their lunches on visits to ensure the risk is absolutely minimal. We have not yet been advised as to when and if schools will be closed and so in the interim, it is important that we give the children as many learning experiences as we possibly can.



## **Attendance Reminders**

Every moment of your child's education is important! Our attendance target is 96%. Please help us to improve our attendance by sending your children to school every day and making sure that they arrive on time! We thank you for your continued support and co-operation.

#### Authorised and Unauthorised Absence. What is the difference?

#### **Authorised Absence**

This is defined as any absence which is unavoidable and will be considered once a reason has been provided. Reasons that **may** be authorised include:

- Absence due to Illness Specific reasons for illnesses are recorded on the register once provided by parents. Please provide medical evidence where applicable. We will make referrals to our school health nurse when deemed appropriate.
- Medical or dental appointments Routine appointments should be, where possible, made outside of school hours. School should be informed before 8:50am if appointments are going to make a pupil late for school. Pupils are expected to attend school before and after routine appointments and ensure that they sign in and out at Reception. Please provide evidence by way of an appointment letter/ card.

Unless a parent informs us of the reason for any absence, that absence will be unauthorised.


You will receive a phone call from the office if you do not inform us as it is our duty to ensure your child is safe. If we cannot make contact with you then you may receive a home visit from a member of staff.

#### **Unauthorised Absence**

This is defined as any absence which is avoidable and where the child would be able to attend school if the parent(s)/carer(s) had not deemed otherwise.

Unauthorised Absence may be if your child does not attend because of:

- Going on holiday or travelling abroad
- · Days off for birthdays, shopping trips
- Feeling tired
- Bad weather
- Non urgent appointment
- Parent unwell to bring them to school





## **Times Tables Badges**

In order to achieve their Times Table Champion badges children have to answer 30 written questions in 2 minutes. They need to achieve a score of 28 or above to receive a badge. Children can work towards Bronze, Silver and Gold Awards from Years 1 - 6.
