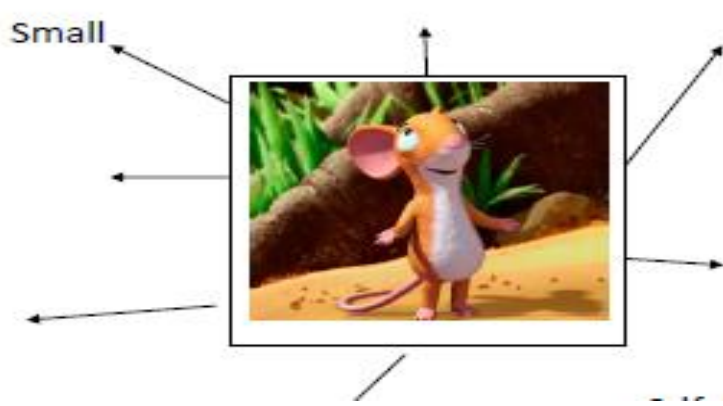
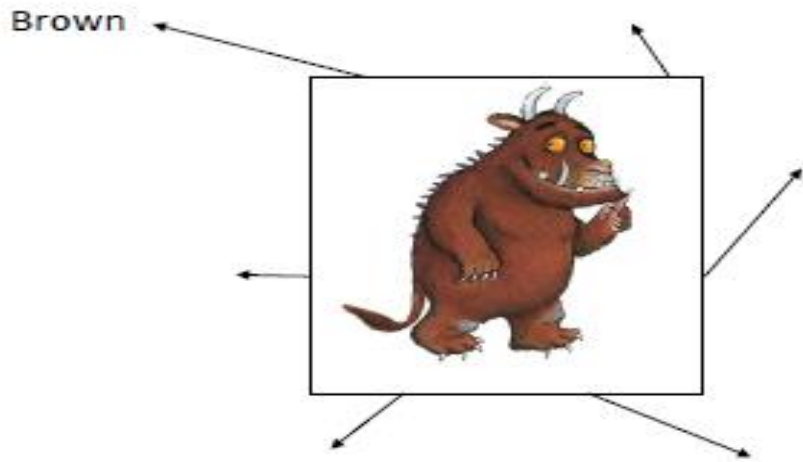
Red words are words that need to be learnt as a whole because they cannot be segmented.



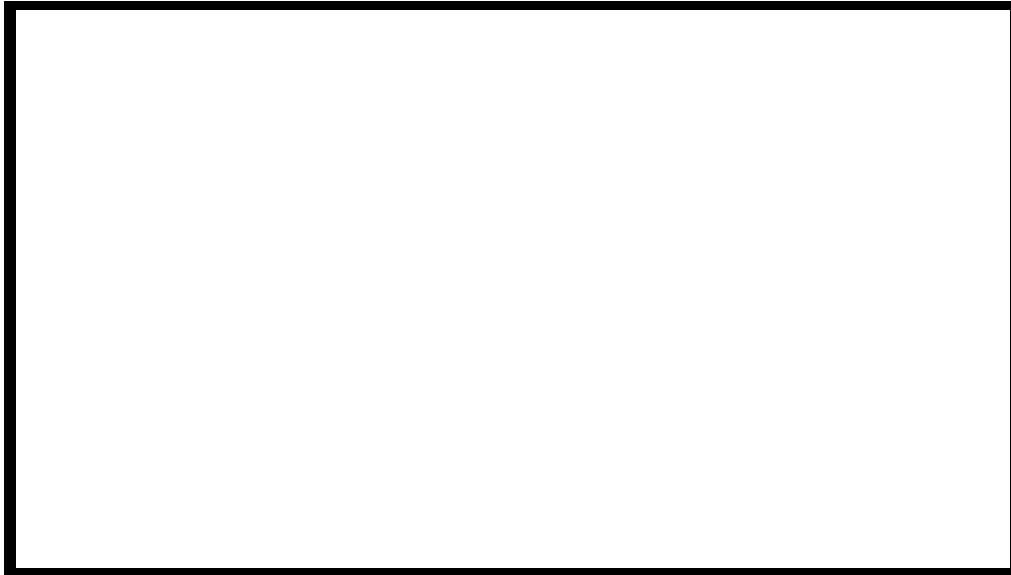
