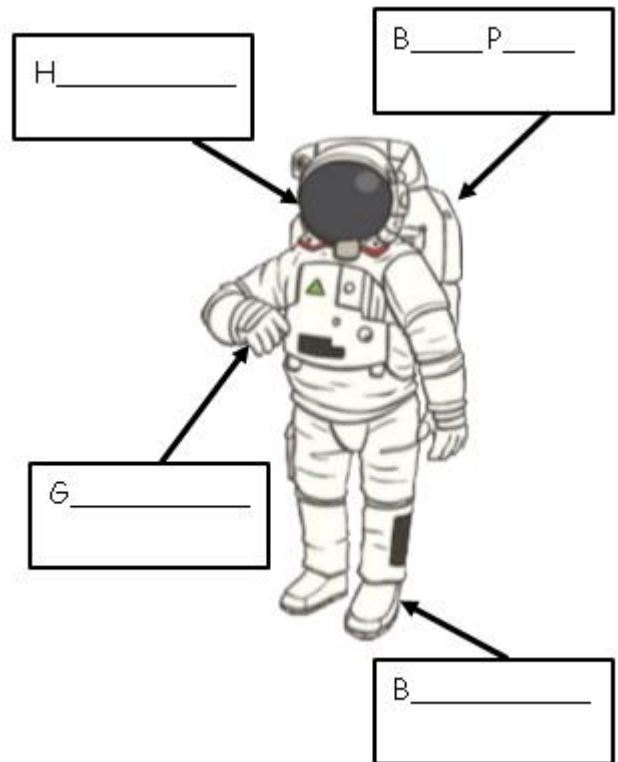

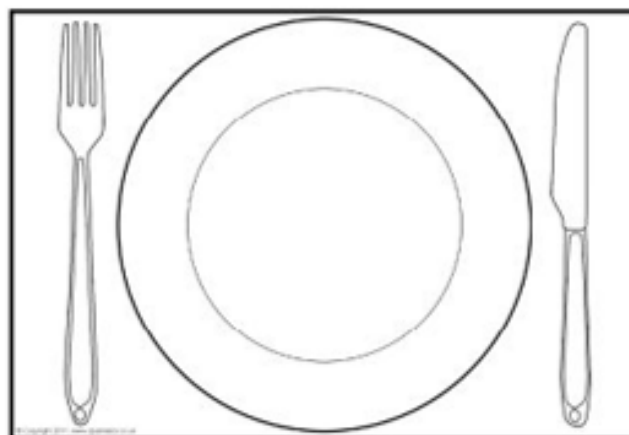

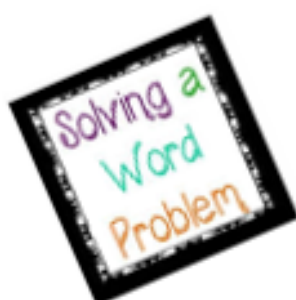

Using exclamation marks



Learn

An exclamation mark **ends a sentence** that shows a strong feeling, like **surprise** or **anger**. They can also show that someone is raising their voice or **shouting**.

Exclamation marks are often used in speech.

The sentence after an exclamation mark always starts with a capital letter - just like after a full stop.

Can you find the exclamation marks? Put a **circle** around each one.

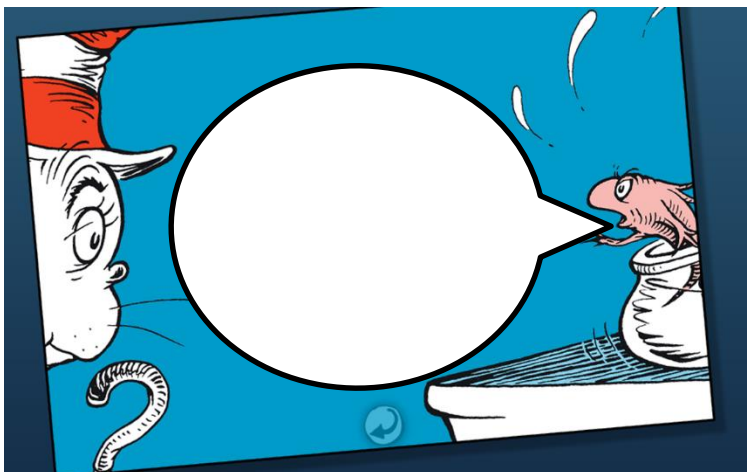

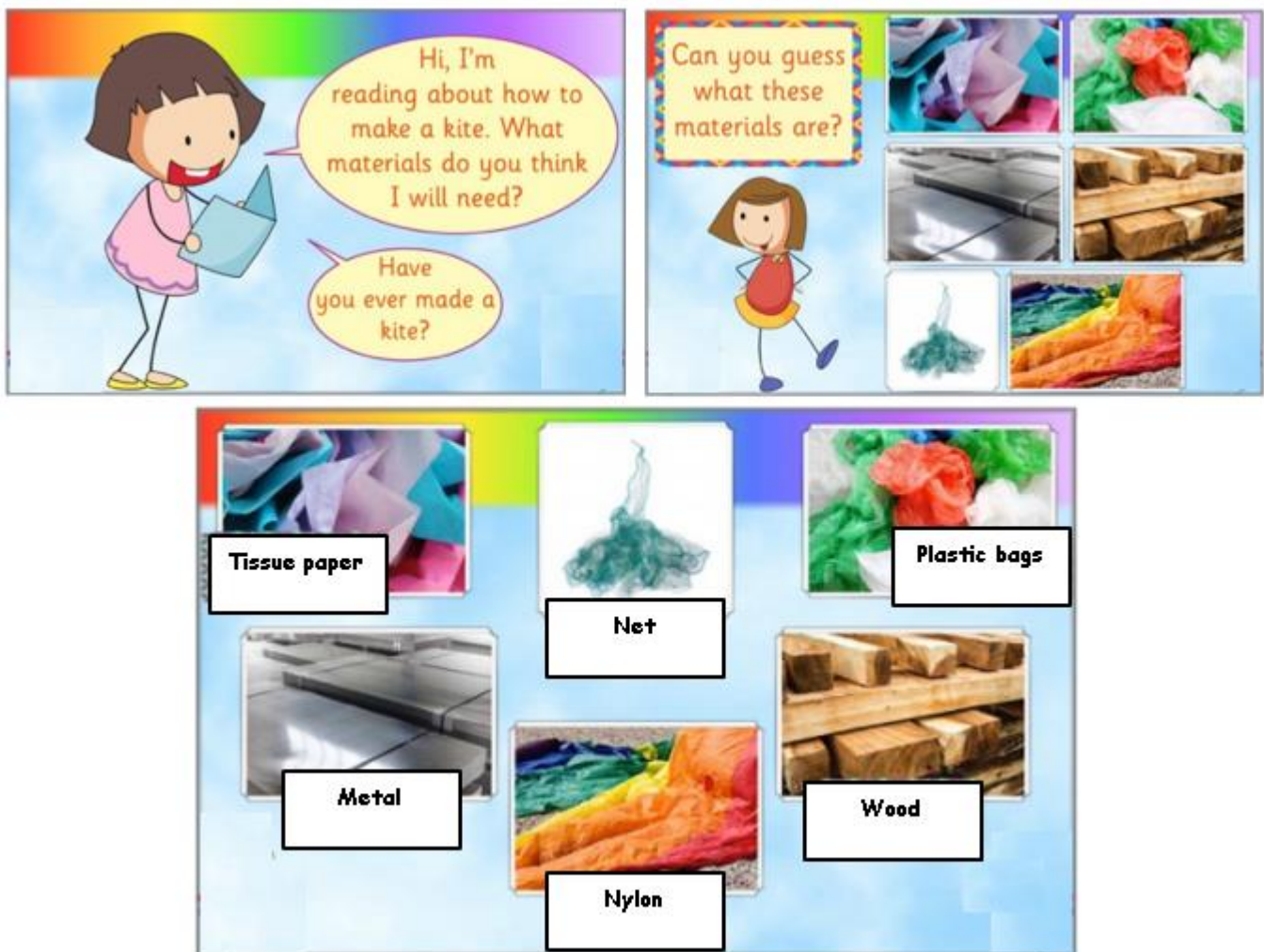
