What Makes a Good Blurb?

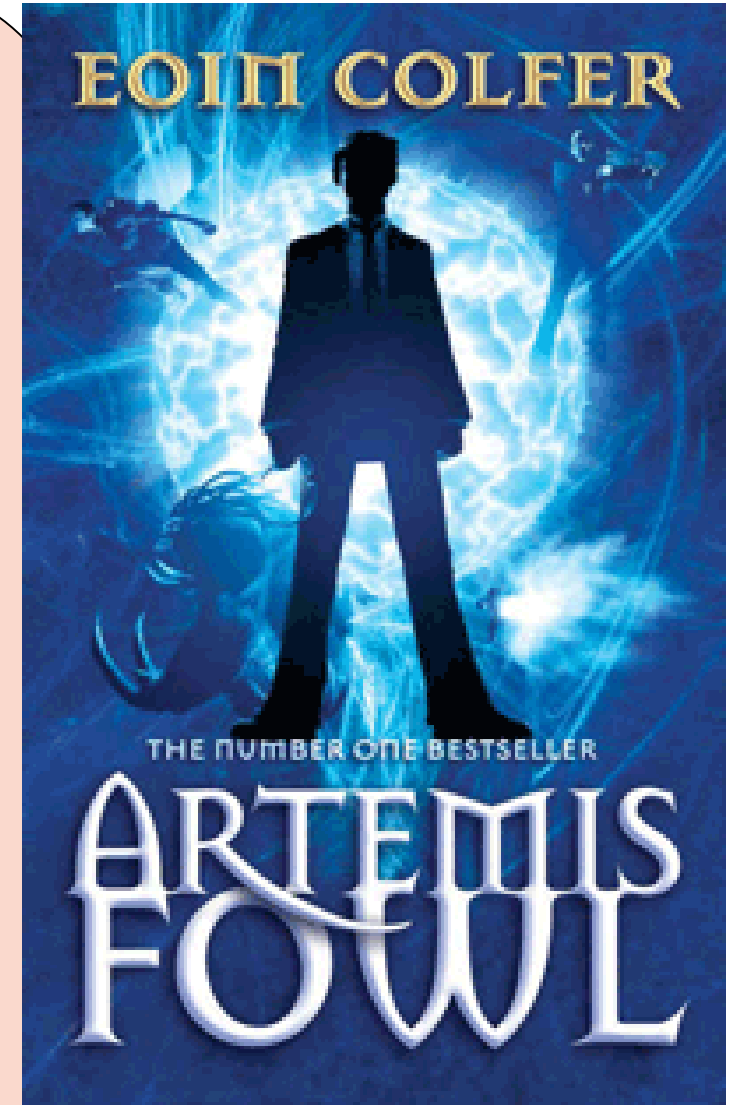
- ☐ They are short in length;

- ☐ They often use question and exclamation marks;
- ☐ They often use an ellipsis to leave the reader asking questions...
