AN EXTRACT OF THE INSPECTION OF BISHOP STOPFORD'S SCHOOL BY OFSTED 19TH JUNE 2018

Following my visit to the school on 19 June 2018 with Yvonne Chisholm, Ofsted Inspector, I write on behalf of Her Majesty's Chief Inspector of Education, Children's Services and Skills to report the inspection findings. The visit was the first short inspection carried out since the school was judged to be good in January 2015.

This school continues to be good.

The leadership team has maintained the good quality of education in the school since the last inspection. Since your appointment as headteacher in September 2016 you have worked closely with governors and the leadership team. You are ambitious for all pupils.

In 2017, pupils' overall attainment in GCSE examinations was strong. The proportion of pupils achieving a good pass in English and mathematics was **significantly above national averages**. Sixth-form students' outcomes in 2017 examinations in applied subjects showed strong progress from their starting points.

Current students and pupils especially disadvantaged pupils are making stronger progress across almost all subjects because of the focused support you provide.

Pupils are proud of their school. They see themselves as part of a close school community. Pupils develop leadership skills both inside and outside school. Pupils said that through working with pupils from other local schools on a number of projects, they have developed social skills and established friendship with pupils from other schools.

You encourage your pupils to be proud of their diverse cultures and backgrounds. Pupils said that there is a 'sense of family' in their school. Staff provide support and care for pupils. Pupils know where to go for help. There is a calm orderly atmosphere around the school. Teachers manage any low-level disruption effectively. Pupils are keen to learn in this positive environment. They take pride in their work and they enjoy school.

Safeguarding is effective.

You and senior leaders have ensured that all safeguarding arrangements are fit for purpose. Leaders ensure that all relevant checks on staff are carried out prior to their employment in the school. Governors have oversight of these checks and take their safeguarding responsibilities very seriously. All staff are trained effectively so they understand how to keep pupils safe.



OUR CURRICULUM

THE JOURNEY TOWARDS ACADEMIC SUCCESS



KEY STAGE 3

Our students get to experience a diverse range of subjects from the moment that they join us in Year 7.

All of our lessons are delivered by specialist teachers who have a detailed understanding of how to enhance the opportunities available to our students. Our lessons are much more than simply delivering content.

Throughout Key Stage 3, our students will follow the traditional subjects of maths, English, science, French, religious studies, geography, history and P.E. In addition they also have the opportunity to develop their creative talents in music, art and drama; and their technological skills in engineering, computer science and food technology.

Our students have access to wellequipped specialist rooms for the delivery of all practical subjects. Thanks to funding from The Belling Trust we have some of the best equipped technology workshops within the area. In maths, students will be set from early in Year 7 in order to tailor teaching and effectively meet the needs of all students. All other subjects are taught in mixed ability groups, this enables our students to form strong friendships with their peers and develop support networks quickly.

During Year 9, students will begin to think about their option choices. This is supported by a programme of visiting speakers and career seminars which help them think about potential career paths and the subjects they will need to study in order to progress to them.

We encourage students to study at least 1 facilitating subject at GCSE (French, geography or history), though many choose to study all of these subjects. In addition to progression from all of the subjects offered during Key stage 3, students are also able to study enterprise, media studies, health & fitness and sociology at Key stage 4.



KEY STAGE 4

We offer a broad and diverse range of subjects at Key Stage 4, enabling all of our students to choose a pathway that fully supports their skills, aspirations and dreams.

Alongside the core curriculum of English Language, English Literature, maths and science, our students have the opportunity to study subjects such as engineering, enterprise, drama, music and media studies.

In addition to this, we offer all students the opportunity to study the full complement of English Baccalaureate subjects including computer science, French, geography and history.

As a church school, religious studies is naturally very important to us and as such all of our students also study RE at GCSE level. This not only provides our students with the opportunity to gain a valuable qualification, it also enables them to explore spiritual ideas and social attitudes, preparing them further for life in the wider world.

The breadth of our Key Stage 4 offer ensures that all of our students have the freedom and opportunity to pursue their own journey to success and supports our wider vision of providing an outstanding, inclusive and aspirational education for our students.










INTERVENTION AND NURTURE PROVISION

Students who struggle with literacy and or numeracy may receive small-group interventions, or if necessary, one-to-one individual support for catch-up literacy, catch up numeracy, and speech, language and communication needs. The school offers small-group nurture provision for students requiring emotional literacy support, and extra-curricular activities are offered via homework club, breakfast club and break-time games club for this cohort. In addition to this, those students in the early stages of English acquisition benefit from small group intervention with our highly experienced English as an additional language (EAL) team who provide on going support.



RELIGIOUS STUDIES & PSHE

Our Christian ethos permeates the curriculum and ensures that moral purpose is central to all that we do.

At Bishop Stopford's School, we believe that all our students should understand what it means to be a good person.

We provide dedicated lessons that help our students to understand their place in the world and their moral and social responsibilities within a community.

Our PSHE lessons cover topics such as bullying, friendship, sex education and spiritual issues. We promote freedom, harmony, love, a belief in personal and social responsibility and respect for British values.

Tutoring time and assemblies also support students in their understanding of these key issues.

We offer our students a wide range of opportunities and excellent learning resources, which enable them to make good academic progress and to develop as individuals.

Our teachers are passionate about their subjects, and they ensure that students achieve academic results that are the passport to higher education and fulfilling careers.

Mutual respect and a shared commitment to learning are the foundations of high standards of achievement at our school; we work hard and we have fun too!

We track the progress that our students are making as they move through the school.

If they fall behind, we take early steps to find out why this is happening, and to help them catch up.

Our very strong music and engineering departments have state-of-the-art equipment. In engineering we have both traditional and manufacturing facilities, such as aluminium casting, laser cutting and 3D printing.

In music we have an industry standard recording studio which students use to record their compositions. They have the opportunity to work alongside professional musicians to record and produce their music.

We expect our students to be punctual, maintain good attendance, and behave well in a safe school. We help them to develop independence and adaptability as they mature and encourage them always to develop their academic abilities and interests.

We attach great importance to our work on improving school attendance in line with targets set by both the local authority and the government.

To this end, attendance is monitored very closely. Schools that work hard to improve attendance, like ours, have seen a measureable improvement in attainment.

The school does not permit holidays in term time.



PUNCTUALITY



Please make sure that your child leaves in good time to take into account any difficulties made by overcrowded buses, heavy traffic and so on.

Students who are late two or more times in one week will serve a detention until 4pm on the Friday of the same week.

All students in Years 7 to 11 must remain on the school site during break and lunch times.

ABSENCE

Absence from school can only be authorised by the school and is only acceptable for sickness or agreed special circumstances. In the case of all known absences it is an expectation of parents/guardians that they write to the Headteacher to request authorised absence or call the attendance officer whenever your child is unable to attend school for any reason which includes illness, medical appointments, college interviews, bereavements etc.

To enable us to authorise absences due to medical appointments (hospital, doctor, dentist, orthodontist or physiotherapist) please provide evidence in the form of an appointment card or letter; this is a legal requirement.

If your child is absent through illness for a prolonged period, it may be possible to send work home; please contact your child's form teacher. It is your child's responsibility on returning to school to find out from teachers what has been missed and to make up this work.

At Bishop Stopford's School our Sixth Form provides an outstanding all round education with both academic and vocational routes of study. Students make impressive progress in a positive, friendly and progressive community.

Studying at Bishop Stopford's Sixth Form offers academic excellence and a motivating, educational environment to further develop professional skills for the work place

In line with our school vision we believe that providing an outstanding and aspirational education is key for all of our students. Enabling students to pursue the pathways of their choice is crucial and in turn we continue to offer a wide range of academic qualifications for our students into our Sixth Form.

As a Sixth Form Centre we are particularly proud of our strong STEM delivery alongside the range of facilitating A levels that we are able to offer, including biology, chemistry, maths physics, English Literature and history. We offer extensive vocational qualifications alongside these more traditional A Level subjects, to ensure that we provide an all-round education for everyone. In doing so we are able to support our students in their journey to success and have been able to see a number of our students progress onto university courses in subjects such as Aerospace engineering with space technology, aeronautical engineering, bio-veterinary science and civil engineering.

We recognise that successful progression comes in a variety of formats and are proud to also offer a partnership with ChoppyCuts Academy, allowing our students to study with us part-time whilst gaining NVQ's in barbering and hairdressing.

All of our students benefit from access to an experienced pastoral team and a comprehensive Careers Support Programme which ensures they are well equipped to make choices in the future and are well informed about the wealth of opportunities for them when they leave school.


