





Literacy

This term in Year 2, our English learning will focus on creating an information leaflet about travel, based on the texts about Grace and her family. They will explore purposes and techniques for diary writing and letter writing. Using a range of sentence type and age appropriate grammatical features to engage the reader, the children will write for a range of audiences. The children also learn common spelling patterns, hold a sentence and transcription through our Read, Write, Inc Phonics programme.



Maths

This term in Maths, the children will strengthen their skills in multiplication and division. The children will practise counting in 2s, 5s and 10s and learn how multiplication and division are connected through sharing and making equal groups. They will also This term, the children will be developing and securing their understanding of length and height, learning how to measure and compare different objects accurately.



They will also be introduced to mass, capacity and temperature, where they will explore how to weigh items, measure liquids and read thermometers. Through practical activities and real-life contexts, the children will build confidence in using standard units of measurement and explaining their reasoning.


Science - Uses of Everyday Materials

This term in Science, the children will be learning about the uses of everyday materials. They will identify and compare a variety of materials, including wood, metal, plastic, glass, brick and fabric, and explore why certain materials are suitable for particular purposes. The children will investigate the properties of materials, such as whether they are strong, flexible or waterproof, and consider how the shape of objects can be changed by bending, twisting, squashing or stretching. Through practical investigations and discussions, they will develop their scientific vocabulary and understanding of how materials are used in everyday life.



RE

In Religious Education this term, the children will be learning about Christianity. Our big question is "How do the symbols of Easter help us to understand the meaning of Easter for Christians?" Children will explore the meaning of the core concept: Salvation. As well as retell and know the Easter story. They will focus on the impotence of the Last Supper and the Crucifixion. Children will also identify and discuss the key symbols about the meaning of Easter for Christians, such as bread, wine and the cross.





Computing

This term in Computing, the children will be introduced to the skills needed for effective searching on the internet.



They will learn how to navigate websites and use search engines carefully to find the information they need. Children will also be taught how to recognise reliable sources and how to search safely, keeping their personal information secure. In addition, they will practise sharing the knowledge they find online with others, using clear and simple explanations. Through these activities, children will develop confidence in using technology responsibly and learn how the internet can be a useful tool for learning and discovering new information.

British Sign Language

This term in British Sign Language, children will continue to improve their communication skills. They will practise signs they have already learned, learn new words, and try making simple sentences using signs. Children will also discover how sign language helps everyone feel included and understand each other, building confidence when communicating without speaking.



PE

This term in P.E, children will keep learning with Tottenham Hotspur coaches to improve their skills through a variety of fun games.



They will practise teamwork, coordination, and ball control, while also learning the rules and strategies of different games. Through this, they will build confidence, resilience, and a positive attitude towards being active and staying healthy.

PSHE

Celebrating Difference

This term in PSHE, the children will be learning about stereotypes and the differences between boys and girls. They will explore how these stereotypes can affect the way people think and behave and learn to make connections between their own experiences and those of others. Children will also take part in discussions about bullying, including why it happens

ART

This term in Art, Year 2 children will explore painting and mixed media. They will learn the names of primary and secondary colours and notice how colours change, predicting what happens when two colours are mixed.



Geography

In Geography this term, our topic is Seaside. In this topic, children will learn about the seaside in the United Kingdom. They will identify and locate seaside towns on a map, including key physical features such as the beach, cliffs, and sea. Children will compare a seaside town to their own local area, noticing similarities and differences in the

and the impact it can have on people. They will learn strategies to stand up for themselves and support others, building confidence and empathy. In addition, children will celebrate the differences they have with their peers, recognising that everyone is unique and special. Through these lessons, they will develop respect, understanding, and positive relationships with the people around them.



Children will describe the colours and textures they see, experiment with different tools to create textures, and decide which tools work best. They will use a variety of textures to make a collaged artwork, applying their knowledge of colour mixing and overlapping shapes to match colours effectively.

environment, weather, and human activities. They will explore how people use the seaside for work and leisure and how it has changed over time. Children will develop their geographical skills by observing and describing features, using simple fieldwork, and recording information through drawings, maps, and basic data.
